

Suggested Supply List

Items on this list are not at all required – they are only suggestions of commonly used items that most students find helpful. Many middle schoolers like to personalize their school supplies and this list is intended to be helpful as you prepare for school, it is not meant to be a shopping list. We will not ask for students to have additional items outside of this list. Our teachers will supply all needed items to those who do not have them or items not on this list.

Backpack

Organizational system

*some students like one binder that has several folders, some prefer a separate folder or notebook with pockets for each class – either option or a combination is great with us

Pencils / pens

*students will do most work with a pencil, but many prefer pens and sometimes pens with fun colors, that's all great but don't get carried away - mainly, we will use pencils

Colored pencils

*used in social studies, language arts & reading, and science classes

Calculator

The calculator students will use at school that is readily available at a variety of local retailers and online sites for around \$15 is a Texas Instruments TI-30x IIS . Incidentally, this is also the model that Springville Jr and High School math classes use. It is helpful to have students use the same model at school and home, but not necessary. A good calculator could be a good investment for now and future years.

Earbuds or headphones

We use several programs on our chrome books that use sound – students will use headphones on a regular basis.

PE clothes

*the semester(s) you have PE you will be asked to bring clothes you can be active in (students will be asked to change for PE) - we anticipate this to be shorts, a T-shirt, and athletic shoes.

Paper

1-2 composition notebooks as well as regular notebook/loose-leaf paper.

Locker decoration items

*low priority but something we often get asked - a lot of students like to put up magnets or have cups for pencil/pen holders – that is great. Students should <u>NOT</u> place stickers on lockers.
